PURPOSE

This Probation Circular introduces arrangements allowing eligible prisoners serving sentences in England and Wales to be released on Home Detention Curfew (HDC) to an address in Scotland. These arrangements will also allow the release of prisoners from Scottish prisons to an address in England or Wales on the Scottish equivalent HDC scheme. Prisoners benefiting from these arrangements will be released under restricted transfer terms (HDC Restricted Transfer).

MANDATORY ACTIONS

Chief Officers must bring this circular to the attention of all staff with immediate effect. Staff must ensure the timeliness of HDC assessments, particularly where the prisoner will be subject to probation supervision on post-release licence as it will be necessary for staff to liaise with the

Scottish Social Work office in obtaining the Home Circumstances report and requesting any additional licence conditions.

SUMMARY

Prisoners who wish to be released to an address in Scotland on HDC will be considered under the eligibility arrangements contained in Prison Service Order 6700 and the amending instructions. Once released on HDC, the electronic monitoring will be carried out as it would be for any other HDC release, but by the current provider in Scotland (Serco). Enforcement arrangements and licence recalls continue to be the responsibility of the Secretary of State in England and Wales and therefore will be determined by the Public Protection and Casework Section (PPCS) in NOMS (formerly known as the Release and Recall Section) as is the case for all other HDC releases. Variations of licence conditions will also continue to be at the discretion of the Secretary of State in England and Wales and so the Governor of the releasing establishment (the 'parent establishment') will continue to be responsible for authorising variations in conditions. Probation Areas will be responsible for making appropriate post-release arrangements with Scottish Local Authority Social Work Services, where appropriate.

Implementation Arrangements

The new arrangements will apply to prisoners with effect from 20 October 2008.

HDC Restricted Transfers:

Prisoners convicted of an offence by an English/Welsh court and who are serving the custodial period of their sentences in England or Wales but who wish to be released on an HDC restricted transfer to a Scottish address must continue to be considered under the existing HDC eligibility criteria as set out in PSO 6700 along with the amending PSIs.

Risk Assessment

General:

The suitability and risk assessment of prisoners who wish to be considered for an HDC restricted transfer to an address in Scotland continues to be the responsibility of the prison holding the offender in England/Wales (the 'parent establishment'). The assessment of home circumstances will be carried out by Scottish Social Work Office but all other parts of the risk assessment, including the decision to grant or refuse HDC will be carried out in the usual way by the parent establishment. However, the process of commissioning the home circumstances assessment will differ depending on whether the prisoner will be subject to post-release licence or not.

Prisoners subject to supervision on release:

Prisoners who will be subject to post-release licence and who wish to benefit from an HDC restricted transfer to Scotland must have the transfer of supervision agreed by the relevant Scottish Local Authority Social Work Services in advance of transfer. The procedures under Chapter 13 of PSO 6000 should be progressed as soon as the prisoner makes an application for the transfer of supervision. PSI 41/2008 advises prison staff to begin this process as early as possible to allow Probation Areas to liaise with the Scottish Social Work Office to seek agreement. If the transfer of post-release licence is not agreed, release on HDC to an address in Scotland cannot take place.

The prison will send the HDC3 Home Circumstances request form to the relevant (ie responsible) probation office in England or Wales. The responsible office must then contact the relevant Social Work office in Scotland using the contact details at Annex B of this circular. The

Offender Manager (OM) will refer the HDC3 to the relevant Social Work office for completion of the home circumstances assessment.

Normal HDC procedures state the HDC3 should be returned within 10 working days but it is likely that additional time will be necessary in these cases. Staff have a further 5 working days to allow for receipt of the completed HDC3.

The HDC3 must be returned to the prison via the probation area. The OM is also required to comment on the HDC application if there is any relevant information held on file that the Scottish Social Worker will not be aware of. This may include information concerning risk and/or victim issues. The OM must inform the Scottish Social Work office of the involvement of Victim Liaison workers and/or MAPPA. Any requests for additional licence conditions must be provided by the OM in consultation with Scottish Social Services.

The returned form should clearly state which Social Work office in Scotland will oversee the prisoner who is subject to post-release Licence.

Prisoners not subject to supervision on release:

The HDC3 must be sent directly to the relevant Scottish Social Work office. England and Wales Probation Areas will not be involved in completing the home circumstances for the offender unless there is evidence in the prisoner's core record (the F2050) that the E/W probation service has expressed an interest in the prisoner's release arrangements (this may be the case where, for example, a Victim Liaison Officer has been appointed or the prisoner is subject to MAPPA.)

Prisoners in custody in England/Wales who are on restricted transfer from Scotland:

Prisoners serving a sentence in a prison in England/Wales, who are on a restricted transfer from Scotland, who wish to be released to an address here, will be eligible to be considered for HDC under the Scottish HDC eligibility criteria. It will be the responsibility of the Scottish Prison Service to instigate all procedures relating to the assessment of suitability for release on HDC. The holding establishment will be asked to comment on the suitability of the prisoner for HDC and must share risk assessment information to enable the SPS to assess suitability for release. Probation Areas will be asked to complete Home Circumstances Assessments.

Monitoring and Supervision

Prisoners released on HDC to an address in Scotland will be monitored by Serco. The contractors will install the tagging equipment, induct the prisoner and will monitor the prisoner during their HDC period under the same principles as if the prisoner were being curfewed to an address in England or Wales. The information provided to prisoners on induction will be broadly similar to that provided to prisoners monitored in England and Wales although there will be some minor practical differences (e.g. contact numbers).

For prisoners who are subject to post-release Licence, the Scottish Social Work office will supervise the offender on behalf of the England/Wales Probation office.

Variations of post-release Licence/Notice of Supervision conditions

If the prisoner requests a permanent variation of the licence conditions, these are carried out in the same way as current variations. The Governor of the releasing prison is responsible for agreeing to the request and signing the amended licence. The licence will then be faxed to the monitoring contractor who must serve it on the curfewee and obtain their signature on the licence.

Requests for Home Circumstances Assessments will be carried out in the same way as for initial HDC consideration (the above paragraphs under 'Risk Assessment' refer).

One-off variations of licence conditions and authorised absences will be dealt with as per the normal policy – i.e. the contractor may approve certain authorised absences and those that cannot be authorised by the contractor must be referred to the releasing Governor for consideration.

Enforcement

Breaches of the curfew condition will be monitored by the contractor as normal and will report violations to the PPCS (formerly RRS) for consideration for recall. PPCS will issue the licence revocation as appropriate and will notify the usual agencies (including the Scottish local police force and the Scottish Social Work office if the offender is subject to post-release Licence).

Return to Custody Following Breach:

The arresting police service will return the prisoner to the nearest local prison, whether that is in Scotland, England or Wales. Once the holding prison is aware that the prisoner is a licence revokee they must report the return to custody of the prisoner to PPCS. PPCS will then send out the representations pack to the prisoner via the holding prison as normal.

The decision whether or not to return the prisoner to a prison in England and Wales will be made on a case by case basis by the governor of the releasing establishment (the 'parent establishment'). It is expected that prisoners released on HDC will not normally be returned to a prison in the parent jurisdiction unless there are circumstances that make it sensible to do so. For example if a curfewee on restricted transfer from England or Wales to a Scottish address is arrested in England for reoffending it is likely to be more sensible to retain the prisoner in the arresting jurisdiction to enable the police to carry out their investigation. Similarly if the prisoner wishes to make oral submissions in his/her representations against recall then the prisoner would need to be returned to English or Welsh jurisdiction to deal with the representations.

Representations against recall

PPCS will be responsible for sending the representations pack to the prisoner, wherever s/he is held. If the prisoner wishes to make representations they must be sent to PPCS. If the prisoner requests an oral hearing s/he must be returned to a prison in England/Wales.

Annex A – Additional Information

Prisoners transferred during the custodial period of their sentence on restricted transfer basis:

Prisoners in custody in Scotland who are on restricted transfer from England/Wales:

Prisoners serving a sentence in a prison in Scotland, who are on a restricted transfer from England/Wales, must be considered for HDC under the England/Wales HDC eligibility criteria. The parent establishment will be responsible for ensuring that the HDC procedures are completed and it will be for the Governor of the parent establishment to make the decision to grant or refuse release. (The parent establishment is the English/Welsh establishment in which the prisoner was last held, excluding prisons used only as staging posts to effect the transfer). The Scottish holding prison will be required to provide much of the information necessary to inform the risk assessment. However the holding prison will not be familiar with the HDC eligibility criteria that apply under the E/W system so the parent establishment must ensure that, through close liaison with the holding establishment, the prisoner's eligibility for HDC is correctly established before further risk assessment work is carried out.

The parent establishment must provide the holding prison with an HDC2 form to give to the prisoner. If the prisoner wishes to apply for HDC and provides a proposed release address the HDC assessment process must commence as normal. The parent establishment will be responsible for ensuring that the Home Circumstances report is commissioned. If the prisoner wishes to be released to a Scottish address (which is likely to be the case) the same procedures must be adopted as the section titled 'Risk Assessment'. The parent establishment must liaise closely with the holding prison to commission the necessary risk assessment information. It will be acceptable for the holding prison either to be asked to provide a written report commenting on the prisoner's suitability for HDC or to complete the HDC 1 and 4 forms, where applicable, but the parent prison must clearly explain the information required in a covering note to the Governor of the holding prison and must ensure that the risk assessment process is fully documented.
